






### Artifact Spotlight

June 20: "Neighborhood Grocery Stores" with Historical Society Board President and historian, Carol Rowe


**July 25:** "Zelda Fitzgerald This Side of Paradise...Her Story" with historian and storyteller, Lynne Rymarz

### Flashback to the Past

Do you know why this publication is called "The Towner Tattler"? A man by the name of John Towner was one of the first settlers in Boone County. He and his wife Hannah along with their eight children moved to what would become Belvidere in the summer of 1835. They followed Scotts Army Trail and eventually, John bought land from Archibald Metcalf and David Dunham. The towners set up their home on the North side of the river.
